




WHAT IS BLACK TIE DINNER?

From its origins as a small fundraising dinner among friends in 1982, Black Tie Dinner has grown into the largest fundraising dinner in the nation for the LGBTQ community. Each year, Black Tie Dinner selects up to 20 non-profit organizations from North Texas as local beneficiaries of its fundraising, as well as the

Human Rights Campaign Foundation as its national beneficiary. To date, Black Tie Dinner has distributed over \$27 million dollars to a wide variety of organizations serving the needs of the LGBTQ community. Black Tie Dinner is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization.



DIGITAL KICKOFF

Black Tie Dinner begins each year with an in-person Kick Off event, designed to highlight that year's selected Beneficiaries. As the community was still not ready for in-person events, we began again this year with a virtual evening of entertainment and education showcasing Black Tie Dinner's 2021 Beneficiaries, mission, and vision for the year.

Thanks to the virtual nature of our event, our Digital Kick Off delivered an expanded number of viewers and participants.



Our Digital Kick Off social media campaign reached over 11,000 users, delivering almost 80,000 impressions on Facebook and Instagram.



Our website, blacktie.org saw a 300% increase in website traffic from those watching our digital live stream and looking for more information about Black Tie Dinner. We reached over 6,500 views of the Digital Kick Off on our social media channels alone.











THE 40TH ANNUAL BLACK TIE DINNER

Black Tie Dinner was thrilled to offer this extraordinary community event in person this year presented by PNC Bank. The 40th Black Tie Dinner was a huge success and featured our signature silent and live auctions, car raffle, and the Black Tie Dinner Ambassador Program. The Dinner awarded not one, but two Raymond Kuchling Humanitarian Awards to Veletta Lill and Chris Luna, both long-time Dallas activists. Josie Totah, joined us via video to be honored with the Visibility Award. The Richard Weaver Volunteer Excellence Award was presented to a local volunteer, John Erdos. From right here in Northeast Texas, D.J. "Shangela" Pierce, was awarded the Vanguard Award. The Dinner was also honored to welcome celebrities Michelle Visage and Niecy Nash and entertainer Todrick Hall for a wonderful closing performance. Longtime advocate and supporter of Black Tie Dinner, Dale Hansen was celebrated, and the Ally Award was renamed in his honor for his commitment to Black Tie Dinner and the LGBTQ community. The Beyond the Tie Live Ask raised over \$125,000 with 450+ donors within 10 minutes for an impressive show of support during The Dinner.

HUMAN RIGHTS CAMPAIGN FOUNDATION

Through research, educational efforts and outreach, the HRC Foundation encourages LGBT Americans to live their lives openly and seeks to change the hearts and minds of Americans to the side of equality.

AIDS SERVICES OF DALLAS

The mission of AIDS Services of Dallas (ASD) is to create and strengthen healthy communities through the delivery of quality, affordable, service-enriched housing for individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS. ASD serves men, women and children in four apartment communities which are located in North Oak Cliff.

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS LONE STAR

Big Brothers Big Sisters leverages one-to-one mentoring relationships to help at-risk youth - including LGBTQ teens--increase their social-emotional competence, academic success, and ability to avoid risky behaviors. BBBS also provides quality community service opportunities for LGBTQ and ally adults, broadening the community's impact across North Texas.

CATHEDRAL OF HOPE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Cathedral of Hope - United Church of Christ is the largest church in the world with a primary outreach to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgendered (LGBT) individuals. About 1,200 LGBT people and their straight allies gather each week to worship a Savior who accepts them just as they are. All are welcome at Cathedral of Hope.

CELEBRATION COMMUNITY CHURCH

Celebration Community Church (CCC) is a nondenominational, multigenerational congregation that works to make people aware that God has called each of us, as equals, into the service of God's people. Our focus is one of social justice. Celebration's congregation consists of people who come from well over forty different religious backgrounds.

COALITION FOR AGING LGBT

The Coalition of Aging LGBT is a non-profit who serves as a catalyst to improve and protect the quality of life of older LGBT adults in North Texas through coordination and collaborations in the areas of health, housing, advocacy, financial security and social services.

DALLAS HOPE CHARITIES

Dallas Hope Charities provides food, shelter, and services that instill dignity, stability, and Hope for All. Dallas Hope Charities operates Dallas Hope Center the city's only LGBTQ-focused Homeless Youth Transitional Living Center and extension program. Dallas Hope Charities operates a Mobile Food Program which provides nutritious meals and food supplies to individuals suffering from hunger and homelessness in the community. Dallas Hope Charities operates Collection of Hope, a community effort to eliminate the hopelessness that leads to suicide in the LGBTQIA+community.

Equality Texas Foundation seeks to secure the dignity, respect, and rights of all LGBTQ Texans through education, community organizing and collaboration. The Foundation works to change hearts and minds by humanizing discrimination faced by Texans based on their sexual orientation or gender identity.

The mission of the Health Education Learning Project is to promote health and prevent disease through innovative, accessible and comprehensive programming.

LAMBDA LEGAL DEFENSE AND EDUCATION FUND


